#### **SCHOOL NEWS**

**CAMP** – Our Year 4/5/6 students sailed off to Stradbroke Island for camp this week. Year 4/5 students stayed for two nights and the Year 6 students for four nights. This camp was the perfect highlight of our Amazing Oceans integrated unit and brought many understandings to life for our students.

The camp has been a mixture of adventurous activities such as boogie boarding at Cylinder Beach, swimming and kayaking at Brown Lake, fishing off the jetty and knowledge activities such as museum tour, didgeridoo and artefacts demonstration, pottery workshop and trivia quiz. These wonderful experiences provide so many opportunities for learning in different ways and allow students to shine in new areas. There might be quite a few requests for boogie boards for Christmas!

Travel requires stamina, resilience and problem solving. For example, we negotiated a bus ride with camp luggage, exited a bus and loaded a boat with camp luggage, exited a boat and loaded a 4WD with camp luggage and then walked 800m to our camp (thankfully without luggage). Every part of this required students to be active listeners, work as a team and maintain a positive attitude. They also read many things along the way to get information. Obviously reading for meaning in context is the ultimate "guided reading" lesson.

We also used this opportunity to help forge new bonds for 2024. Our Year 4 and 5s had the opportunity to spend quality time together in preparation for being our senior class. They are going to be a great team and we're really excited to plan a wonderful year for them. Our year 6s also got to savour some special moments with their classmates before they're off to high school.

SEA WORLD - On Tuesday, the students in Prep to Year 3 went on an excursion to Sea World. They had an amazing day exploring the park and seeing lots of animals they had been discussing in class. Students got to see the penguins, jellyfish, polar bears (for those who were lucky enough), sting rays, sharks, a variety of fish and the dolphins. The dolphins soon became everyone's favourite after attending the Affinity Dolphin Presentation. Students got to see what amazing animals dolphins are. They did some amazing tricks and flips before we had the opportunity to have a Q and A session with one of the dolphin trainers (a marine mammal specialist). The students were excited to have lots of their questions answered by an expert in the field! #### **HEAD LICE**

A letter was emailed home yesterday regarding head lice. Please ensure you have read it thoroughly and followed the advice. (see below)

If you do find head lice, commence treatment immediately and be sure to complete the process of treatment. This will help prevent head lice from spreading. Remember to keep checking your family member's heads every 2 days until there are no head lice found for 10 consecutive days.

For further information regarding treating head lice, refer to the Department of Health's Head Lice fact sheet. Your local pharmacist can provide advice regarding head lice treatment options and head lice combs.

To reduce your child's risk of getting head lice, make sure that long hair is tied up and that all children remember to bring their own hats to school.

Remember, anyone can get head lice – they have no preferences for cleanliness, hair colour, hair type, ethnicity or age.

#### **CURRICULUM ARTICLES**

Prep/1 – Over the last few weeks in the P/1 room, we have been continuing our poetry unit by continuing our study of the song 'Under the Sea' from the Little Mermaid. Students are really loving listening to the song and identifying the rhyming words as well as discussing the rhythm (syllables/beats). In Maths, we have been looking at numbers to 20. We have been counting to and from 20, writing the numbers in the right order and representing numbers on a thinkboard. Thinkboards allow students to show understanding of a number by using ten frames, drawing a picture to represent their number and connect the number to real life situations. We also had a great time at our Life Education visit. Healthy Harold came to talk to the class about recognising the

importance of friendships and helped them to practice strategies to help manage their feelings and emotions.



1/2 - We have been finalising our unit on money in Maths. We are now embarking on a two week learning journey to discover fractions. This will include finding fractions of a collection, creating fractions and representing fractions including whole, half, quarters and eighths. This will finalise our assessable elements for mathematics for the year which is very exciting. Students will continue with further work in number. We are still deconstructing the song "under the Sea" for our poetry unit. We now know, and understand, nouns, rhyme, repetition and alliteration. There is still work to be done in understanding syllables in words and replacing them, keeping the syllable count the same, and also having them rhyme. For little minds this is a complex task but we are understanding more and more each day and can't wait to hear our friend's final creations. We are all very much enjoying creating art pieces of our favourite sea animals to help decorate our room for the final weeks of the school year.

**3/4** — We have been learning about more poetic devices, including onomatopoeia, puns and neologisms. Students have also been practising their poetry writing skills. In Maths, the Year 3s have been representing fractions and learning about equivalent fractions. The Year 4s have been practising their equivalent fractions too, as well as mixed numbers and an introduction to decimals. We have finished off our HASS and Digital Technology assessments. The Year 4's went off to Stradbroke Island from Monday to Wednesday for camp, with the Year 3's attending the SeaWorld excursion on Tuesday.

**5/6** – It has been an exciting time in the 5/6 class with students commencing their adaptation of a poem as part of our Amazing Oceans Unit. In Maths, students have been working on their assessment "All about Measurement" before they move on to our financial unit of work when we get back from camp! In Science, students are conducting experiments about reversible and irreversible change with Mrs Street. This week the Year 5s and 6s were attending Stradbroke Island for camp. The Year 5's returned on Wednesday and the Year 6's today.
